

Supported Operating Systems

Question:

From april issue of MSDN magazine I know, that for correct showing of menu items in shell context menu, should be separately implemented support of each operating system (separately for Windows XP, XP X64, Vista, etc.). It is very hard to do such large amount of job - add support of all modern operating systems. On what operation systems my menu items will be shown using Windows Explorer Context Menu?
